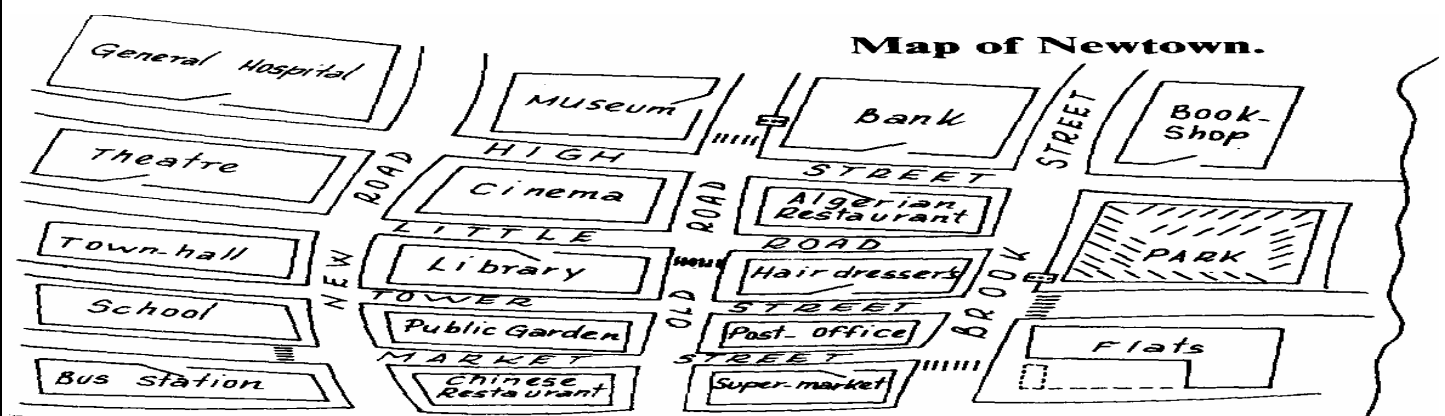

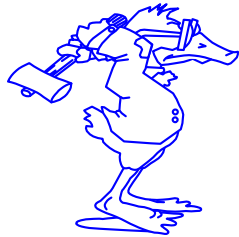

Most of the two-syllable words are stressed as follows:
