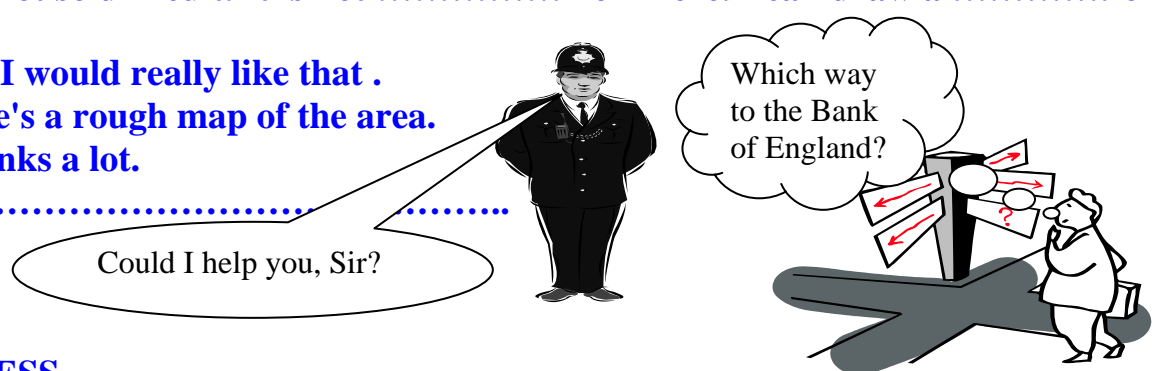

**Aim:** pps identify the position of the primary stress in words.

In English, we do not pronounce each syllable with the same force. In one word, we pronounce ONE SYLLABLE VERY LOUDLY and all the other syllables very quietly.

E.g. petrol – husband – common – answer

Most of the two-syllable words are stressed as follows:

STRESS ON THE 1 <sup>ST</sup> SYLLABLE IF IT IS NOT A PREFIX	STRESS ON THE 2 <sup>ND</sup> SYLLABLE IF IT IS A PREFIX
common	dislike
answer	undo
market	mistake
silent	unreal
ticket	irrelevant
